# COSTS/REGISTRATION PROGRAM

## Tuition & Fees

The College Board of Trustees reserves the right to alter tuition and fees at any time by the amount necessary to maintain the institution or as required by the Wyoming Community College Commission.

All tuition and fees are due at the designated dates on the account statement. All checks or money orders should be made payable to Western Wyoming Community College. **Sweetwater County residents age 60 and over may enroll for classes at the College with payment of tuition waived.** Special fees for laboratory supplies, etc., remain the financial responsibility of each student. The tuition schedule is for full-time credit students who take twelve or more credit hours and part-time credit students who take eleven or fewer credit hours. This tuition is a per-semester cost.

## Part Time Students

### Students taking 5 or fewer credits

- Payment due date is Friday, January 6.
- Students registering after January 6 must pay at the time of registration. If payment isn't received or proof of approved financial aid available, registration will be voided.

### Students taking 6-11 credits

- Pay in full by Friday, January 6 or,
- Pay \$250 intent and set up payment plan.

## Intent Deposit

Students enrolled in 6 or more credits must pay an intent deposit. The intent deposit is required to hold your seat in courses for the upcoming term. Intent deposits are applied towards your total bill. Students who do not pay their intent deposit by the deadline, or do not have proof of financial aid, will be administratively withdrawn from their courses.

Students receiving financial aid (an award letter must have been signed and returned to the college) are not required to pay the intent deposit.

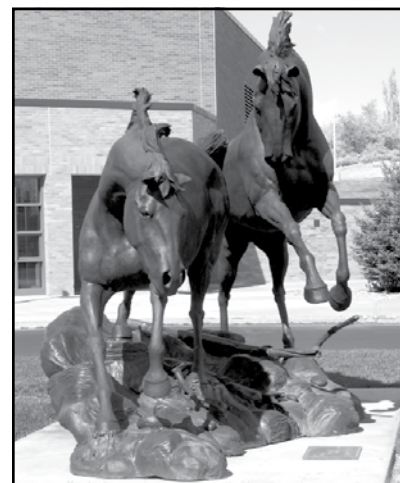
## WWCC New Student Registration Program

## Waitlists

**Students may be placed on a waitlist if a course is full.** When a seat becomes available the student will be sent an **email** (using Mustang Cruiser or a personal email address) notifying them that a seat has become available. The student will have three days to add the course to their schedule through “Managing My Waitlist” in Mustang WebAdvisor or by calling Registration & Records. It is ultimately the responsibility of the student concerning their position on any given waitlist.

**Being on a waitlist does not complete the registration process.** Students are not automatically enrolled when a space opens. If you have decided against the wait listed course, please have your name deleted from the waitlist by using “Managing My Waitlist” in Mustang WebAdvisor or by calling Registration & Records at 382-1641.

## Dropping Classes

Students must officially drop classes to avoid failing grades. See the full semester drop deadline on the academic calendar. Shorter duration courses have different drop dates. Students should be familiar with these dates. Refunds go into effect when the process is completed. Contact Registration & Records or the Green River Center for more information.

## High School Students

WWCC offers tuition scholarships for qualified high school students. Sweetwater County BOCES pays for up to 6 credit hours, plus course fees, for approved high school juniors and seniors taking dual enrollment courses. Contact your high school counselor or Registration & Records with questions.

# Residency Classification

The following residency policy was developed under the auspices of the Wyoming Community College Commission and applies to all community colleges in Wyoming:

A student previously classified as a nonresident may be reclassified any time prior to the end of the published refund period of any term in which he/she qualifies.

A student who is classified as a resident by one community college will be considered a resident at all colleges.

## Classification Procedures:

1. Residence classification shall be initiated for each student at the time the application for admission is accepted and whenever a student has not been in attendance for more than one semester. All students must respond to the residency question on the application for admission. Students wishing to request a review of the residency decision must submit documentation along with the “Initial Residency” decision or the “Change of Residency” form to the Registrar in Registration & Records.
2. Only individuals or their legal dependents who are U.S. citizens or are in an immigrant status and certain nonimmigrants may qualify for residency.
3. Nonimmigrants and their dependents, who possess a valid visa from the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services with a classification of Temporary Workers or Intracompany Transferee and eligible for education, may qualify for residency. Eligibility for consideration will be based on the privileges and limitations of the visa held by the applicant.
4. Students will be required to submit appropriate documentation to support the residency claim.

The following may be used by a student and would result in an individual being classified as a Wyoming resident for tuition purposes:

1. A graduate of a Wyoming high school or recipient of a GED in Wyoming who enrolls in a community college within twelve months of either high school graduation or GED completion;
2. An individual who can provide written verification that he/she has lived in Wyoming continuously for one year prior to enrolling;
3. A legal dependent under the age of 24, or a spouse of a resident of the State of Wyoming who qualified as a resident based upon this policy;
4. A legal dependent under the age of 24 of a Wyoming community college graduate;
5. A student who marries a Wyoming resident shall be granted resident classification at the beginning of the next term following the marriage;
6. Active Wyoming National Guard members and U.S. Armed Forces members stationed in Wyoming, and their dependents.
7. Members of the United States Armed Forces who move to Wyoming within 12 months from the date of honorable discharge from the service.
8. An individual who can provide written verification from an employer that he/she will be employed in Wyoming for an anticipated period of not less than seven months, and such employment is the principal means of support. This letter must be on company stationery, signed by the owner, manager or personnel department and must indicate the date the employee started, his/her status (full or part-time) and the expectation that the person will be employed at least seven months.
9. Persons temporarily absent from the state due to military services, attendance at educational institutions, or other types of documented temporary absences will not have their resident status void by such absence;

10. People who do not reside in Wyoming but who meet the following criteria will be considered resident students:

- a. Has been employed in Wyoming for at least seven months, and such employment is the principal means of support;
- b. Pays Wyoming taxes as required by law;
- c. Resides in a state with a similar law; and
- d. Is willing to submit an affidavit to the above.

Any questions or concerns about the residency policy should be addressed to the Registrar in Registration & Records.

Appeals and exceptions to the above policy should be addressed to the Vice President of Student Success Services. Students wishing to appeal that office’s decision, may go through the Student Success Services Appeal process.

## Western Undergraduate Exchange Program(WUE)

WWCC participates in the WUE program along with 15 other Western states (Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington and Nebraska). On a space-available basis, students from these states may enroll at WWCC in any program for 1-1/2 times the in-state tuition rate. Eligible students should address questions to Registration & Records.

## Payment Plan

Students enrolled in 6 or more credits who cannot pay the full amount of Spring 2012 tuition, fees, room and board may set up a payment plan.

- See payment dates above.
- A \$50.00 setup/processing fee is charged for each payment plan.
- Students enrolled in 6 or more credits are automatically placed on a payment plan if balance is not paid by the Friday, January 27 deadline, and a \$10 late fee is charged.

## Refunds

### Full Semester Courses

<b>January 17</b> .....	100% refund for courses dropped by this date
<b>January 18 - 27</b> .....	80% refund for courses dropped during this time
<b>January 28 - February 6</b> .....	60% refund for courses dropped during this time
<b>February 7 - 16</b> .....	40% refund for courses dropped during this time
<b>February 17</b> .....	NO refund for courses dropped on, or after, this date

**Refund and repayment for Federal Financial Aid recipients may be different.**

Use Mustang WebAdvisor to drop courses through March 30 (full semester courses). See instructions on page 8.

Complete withdrawals should be initiated at Registration & Records, Green River Center, or an Outreach site and cannot be done using Mustang WebAdvisor.

**NOTE: Block courses are on a reduced schedule for drop/add dates and refunds. Contact Registration & Records or the Green River Center for exact dates.**

## Return of Title IV Funds

Students withdrawing their attendance from Western Wyoming Community College that received some form of federal financial assistance (Pell Grant, Student Loan, SEOG, ACG, or LEAP grant), may be subject to repaying all or a portion of the funds received.

WWCC will calculate the amount of aid that students earned based upon the number of days attended in the semester. Any portion not earned must be repaid. Should students choose not to make satisfactory repayment arrangements:

- they will be ineligible to receive funding in the future at WWCC
- their transcripts may be withheld
- they may be turned over to collections for the unpaid balance in addition to any additional charges incurred by the collection agency

## Getting Financial Assistance

Students enrolled in a **minimum of six credits** at Western Wyoming Community College are encouraged to apply for financial aid. Some students enrolled in less than 6 hours may also be eligible for financial aid. There are generally two types of aid available at WWCC: aid based on assessed financial need and aid awarded based on academic excellence or area of major.

Students interested in Federal Aid or WWC Foundation grants must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Applications can be accessed from the WWCC Financial Aid webpage. Before financial aid awards are disbursed, students must have applied and been accepted for admission, and be degree seeking at WWCC.

**April 1 is the priority deadline for financial aid at WWCC.** Applications received by this date will receive priority consideration for all available monies. Applications received after that date will be processed as the financial aid file is completed.

### Mustang WebAdvisor Capabilities:

Students can access a variety of financial aid information via Mustang WebAdvisor.

- Students can view their award letter for the current academic year once their financial aid file is complete and the financial aid office has reviewed their eligibility and packaged their awards.
- Students can also accept or decline the aid that has been offered to them utilizing this medium.
- It also will direct them to the Master Promissory Note (Student Loan Application).
- Students can view their financial aid status by year or specific term.

This information is accessed by using your Mustang WebAdvisor login and password.

Financial Aid Awards usually consist of a combination of the following:

### Federal Aid Programs:

*Federal Pell Grant* – Federal Grant money available to qualifying students attending approved post-secondary institutions.

*Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG)* - Federal grants available to students with the lowest family contribution.

*Federal Work Study* – Student employment available to a limited number of students with need who choose to earn part of their educational expenses.

*Academic Competitiveness Grant (ACG)* – Federal Grant available to Pell eligible students that completed an approved rigorous high school program.

### Federal Direct Loans:

*Subsidized Loans* – Need-based federally subsidized loans available to college students which are funded by the Federal Direct Loan Program. Current interest rate is fixed at 6.8%, and repayment obligations begin six months after the student completes their education or stops attending on a part time basis. Entrance and exit counseling is required in order to receive these funds.

*Unsubsidized Loans* – Federal loans available to college students which are funded by the Federal Direct Loan Program. Entrance and exit counseling is required in order to receive these funds. Fixed interest rate of 6.8%.

*Federal PLUS Loans* – Federal loans available to parents whose children attend post-secondary institutions. Interest rate is fixed at 8.5%. Repayment begins immediately after loan disbursement.

### Institutional Aid Programs:

Western offers a variety of scholarships to High School Seniors based on academic excellence. They include the Superior Student Scholarship, Sweetwater County High School Graduate Scholarship, Honor Scholarship, Performance Scholarship; Opportunity Scholarship and Career Scholarship (award includes state of Wyoming funds for Hathaway eligible students), Sweetwater County High School Graduate Scholarship, competition and special ability grants. Divisional Scholarships are available to sophomore students. Scholarships are also available to qualifying transfer, part-time and non-traditional students.

### WWC Foundation Aid:

Grants provided through donor participation, ranging in value from \$250-\$2,500 per academic year.

### Veteran's Benefits:

Information and applications can be obtained from the Veteran's Representative in the Financial Aid Office, and online on the College's webpage.

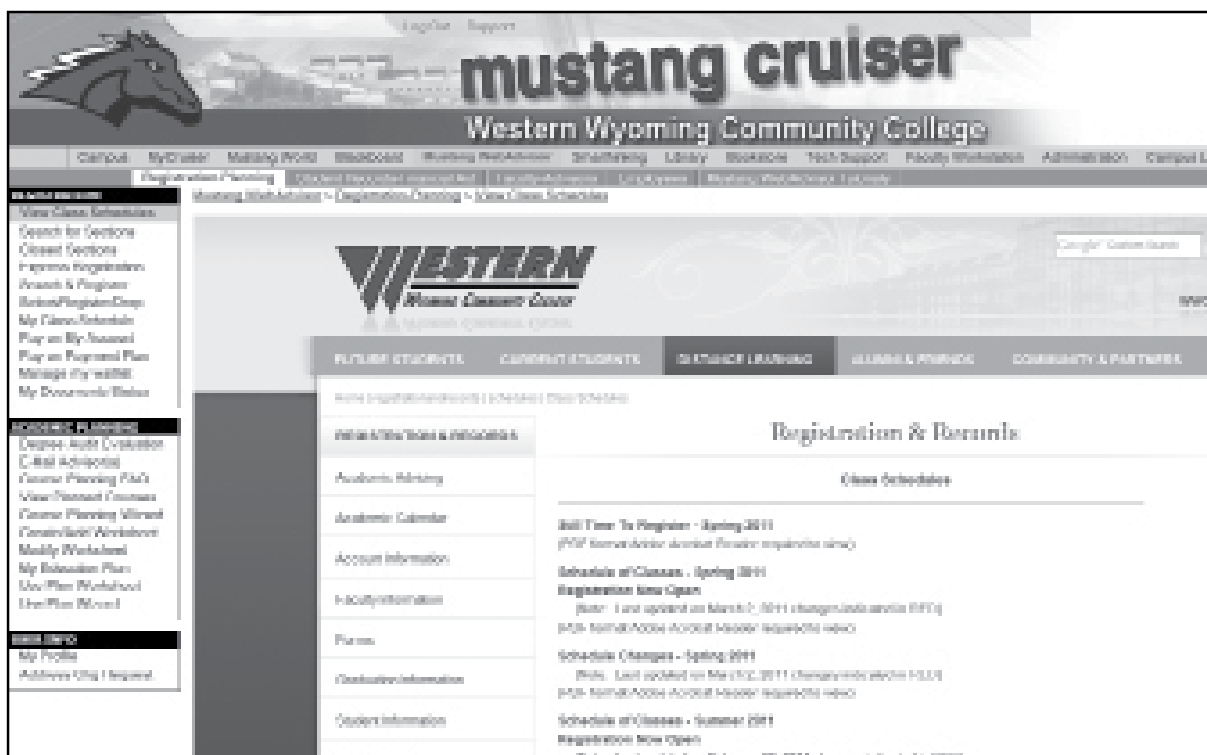

## PLACEMENT TESTS

All students who are degree seeking or full-time are required to take the COMPASS test. Part-time, non-degree seeking students who take math, US Government courses, English, General Chemistry and Biology courses must also complete the placement test. **Students may retake the exam once per semester.** The cost for retakes is \$10. Any student who feels they did not do as well as they could, should talk to the ACE IT Center about preparing for the exam.

**Students should call to make a reservation for the tests: Rock Springs (307) 382-1600, Green River (307) 872-1301.**

**MATH & ENGLISH** – students may register for math or English classes after scoring to the appropriate level on the COMPASS. Continuing students who are currently taking a math or English class may register in the next level if they have achieved an A, B, or C grade in the current semester's class.

**Students should also carefully monitor their reading score. Reading is critical for success in all college-level courses and poor reading ability often results in problems in classes. Please enroll in the appropriate required reading courses.**

**Students with high ACT score of 21 or higher may be exempt from the Placement Test. Please contact the ACE IT Center at (307) 382-1660 for details.**

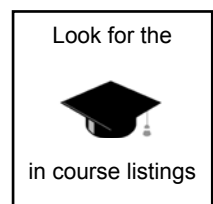

## Keys to a Successful Transfer Planning

- Select a major early in the process.
- Until you've selected a major, enroll in classes appropriate to any major. Select a transfer institution early. Keep a catalog from the school readily accessible during WWCC advising sessions.
- While investigating majors, be sure you enroll in general education courses appropriate to any major.
- Use your WWCC faculty advisor as a resource and referral agent.
- Come to Registration & Records or Student Learning with any questions.

## Knowledge/Awareness

- Know the WWCC catalog.
- Be aware that developmental coursework (numbered <1000) is not meant to transfer and does not count towards WWCC AA, AS, ADN and AFA degrees.
- There are limited elective credits in any program.
- Be aware that occupational courses are usually not meant to transfer.

## Watch Your Grades

- Generally, grades less than "C" do not transfer (particularly if they are general education requirements).
- Many transfer institutions require a certain cumulative GPA for transfer students.
- WWCC requires a 2.00 GPA for graduation.

## Watch Your Hours

- Generally a maximum of 70 hours transfer from WWCC to a four-year institution.

Students who plan to transfer from WWCC to the University of Wyoming should be aware of a number of things that make the process a simple matter.

1. **Transfer Agreement for WWCC Graduates:** WWCC graduates with an AA or AS will transfer to UW under a guaranteed agreement. The agreement states that WWCC graduates will have met all of UW's lower division general education (called University Studies at UW) requirements with the exception of a second math requirement. Students can complete the second mathematics course either at WWCC or at the University.
2. **Course Numbering System is the Same:** UW and all 7 Wyoming Community Colleges use the same name and number for all equivalent transfer courses. Thus, English 1010 has the same name and number at all 8 schools. To know which courses are equivalent, use the Transfer Guide (see below).
3. **Transfer Guide:** The Transfer Guide lists all the courses that transfer from the 7 community colleges to UW. It lists equivalent courses and transfer courses. *Equivalent* courses have the same name and number at all 8 institutions. *Transfer* courses transfer to UW even though they may not be taught at all colleges or at UW. The Guide also lists all of UW's general education requirements (University Studies Program) and which courses meet those requirements. All advisors and Registration & Records have copies of the *Transfer Guide*.
4. **No Limit on Number of Credit Hours That Transfer:** There is no limit to the number of credits WWCC students may transfer to UW; however, how these courses fulfill requirements specific to a UW program of study will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis.
5. **Transfer Agreement for Students Who Transfer Without an AA or AS:** Students who transfer with less than an AA or AS degree or with an occupational degree, or other associate degree, will have their transcript evaluated on a course-by-course basis based on the Transfer Guide. Such students will have to meet UW's general education requirements, i.e. complete WWCC courses that meet UW's University Studies requirement. ## NOTIFICATION OF STUDENT RIGHTS UNDER THE FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT

FERPA (also known as the Buckley Amendment) was originally passed in 1974. It has been amended several times since, but the essence remains unchanged. Primary rights for students under FERPA include:

1. Right to inspect and review educational records within 45 days of the day the request is received. Submit your request in writing to the Registration & Records.
2. Right to seek to amend educational records. If you think that something in your file is inaccurate, you may make a written request to have that record changed.
3. Right to have some control over the disclosure of information from educational records except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.
4. Right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by WWCC to comply with the requirements of FERPA.

# CREDIT COURSE INFORMATION

## Explanation of Course Numbers

Each course is assigned seven digits. The first three or four digits indicate the area of study (for example, Art): the center four digits indicates course level (0900 means nontransferable, 1000 means freshman level, and 2000 means sophomore level).

**Courses numbered less than 1000 are nontransferable, non-graduation courses.**

All Green River Credit Classes have a "G" in the last two digits of the course number, have a ♻ before the course and list GRC as the building. Evening courses are indicated with a C.

## Note on Class Size

# DISTANCE EDUCATION

## Internet Courses

- Be able to study at least 9 hours per week for a 3 credit course,
- Have strong time-management skills, computer skills, and self-motivation.

- Have access to the Internet and MS Word 2003 or higher.
- Use the e-mail address provided to you by the college.

- Be comfortable with using a computer and MS Word 2003. To brush up on your computer skills, take one of the non-credit online computer courses.
- Be comfortable sending e-mails with attachments.

If you are new to online learning, please take the “Intro to Online Learning” HMDV 1025, offered in Spring, Summer, and Fall Semesters.

## COMPUTER APPLICATIONS (OIS)

The OIS Lab is used for computer instruction in an individualized format and in a classroom setting. The lab also has several computers available for students to use for homework assignments, internet classes and email communication.

Departments that have offerings in the Lab include Computer Applications, Computer Science, and Business Office Technology. Computers are available Monday through Thursday from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Weekend lab times will be announced at the beginning of the semester. An instructor or lab assistant is readily available to assist each student.

Courses listed below as FLEXIBLE (See Time column) are individualized. Students work at times that are convenient for them. In addition to registering for the course, the student must come to the OIS Lab during the first week of classes to schedule an orientation session with the instructor. The student should then plan to spend the appropriate hours of lab time per week to finish the assigned lessons by the weekly due dates. These hours may be arranged for daytime or evening hours to suit the student's schedule and may vary from week to week. Lab assistants and instructors are available for assistance.

## DEVELOPMENTAL STUDIES

Learning Center (RSC, Room 2051) Hours: 8 A.M. - 5 P.M., M-TH, and 8 A.M. - 12 P.M., F; Evening hours vary each semester.

- Reading** – Students learn to improve their ability to understand and apply college reading materials.
- Grammar** – Students learn parts of speech, sentence structure, grammatical correctness, punctuation and capitalization.
- Spelling** – Students learn to improve their spelling skills using a phonetics or rule approach.
- Vocabulary** – Students learn to improve their ability to understand college level vocabulary.
- Writing** – Students learn to organize their ideas and express their thoughts more clearly. This course is partially designed to help students improve their research papers and essay tests.
- English for Non-Native Speakers** – ESL courses are designed to assist the specific needs of non English speaking students in reading, writing, grammar, vocabulary, spelling and listening.

- All students registering for a Learning Center (LC) class must meet with an instructor in the Learning Center the first week of class.
- In order to earn one credit, a student must schedule two hours per week per credit with an instructor in the LC. Class times are to be arranged the first week of class.

- Learning Center classes may be added until two weeks after midterm.
- Non-native classes are for non-native English Language students.
- In addition to college preparatory classes, the Learning Center offers preparatory classes for the GED Test.
- Students with a COMPASS Reading Score of 70 or below or (ACT Reading score of 19 or below) are **required** to take HMDV 1000 College Studies. Students with a COMPASS Reading score of 40 or below **must** enroll in BAS 0510.

Learning Center courses listed below as FLEXIBLE (See Time Column) are individualized. Students must attend an orientation session in the Learning Center during the first week of classes and select a class meeting time from those listed below. Students are required to attend two hours a week for each course in which they are enrolled.
